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In conversation with renowned Medical Educationists!

Department of Medical Education has taken the initiative to interview renowned Medical Educationists around the globe. This issue will feature interviews of Prof. Dr. Syeda Kauser Ali and Brig. Dr. Mowaddat Hussain Rana.

Prof. Dr. Syeda Kauser Ali is amongst the pioneers of medical education in Pakistan. She started her journey as a trainee medical educationist in the Department of Medical Education at College of Physicians & Surgeons, Pakistan in 1991. She received a WHO Fellowship for Master of Health Professions Education (MHPE) program at the University of Illinois, Chicago. She then returned to CPSP and rose to the rank of Director ME. At CPSP, she was instrumental in the capacity building of CPSP supervisors and examiners, improvement of CPSP examinations, and development of structured fellowship and membership curricula. She started the first qualification in health professions education in Pakistan (DCPS-HPE). Later, she joined the department for educational development (DED) at AKU, where she led the development of examination blueprints for the undergraduate and postgraduate programs in medicine and nursing and also contributed to the development of competency-based residency curricula. She was the recipient of AKU's best teacher award and faculty development award for Ph.D. in ME. Currently, Dr. Kauser is the Chairperson at the Institute of Medical Education, Jinnah Sindh Medical University, and is working to enhance the quality of education through capacity building of faculty members, improving the curriculum and program of assessment. She has led the development of a longitudinal curriculum in professionalism, patient safety, and communication for the MBBS and BDS programs and has started the first Ph.D. program in health professions education in the province of Sindh.

Brig. Dr. Rana is a Sitara-e-Imtiaz awarded psychiatrist who has received Honors and university distinction in Physiology, Forensic medicine, special Pathology, and Medicine.

He has published papers on mental illness, violence, myth, and reality in the Armed Forces Medical Journal. His research papers have been extensively published in both national and international journals. He has served as the Chief Editor of the journal of Pakistan Psychiatric Society, as the Director of Center for Trauma Research and Psychosocial Interventions, and is the former Dean of the Faculty of Psychiatry, College of Physicians and Surgeons Pakistan and advisor in Psychiatry Armed Forces Institute of Mental Health.

Basic Life Support Program



DME initiated a Basic Life Support Program in liaison with the Cardiology department. In a span of 8 weeks, certified BLS trainers have trained 84 final-year MBBS students to provide basic life support. The aim of the BLS program is to train all the undergraduate medical students during their MBBS program. DME aims to extend the BLS program to train the teaching faculty as well.

IT Skills (Basics of MS Excel) training workshop



A session on IT skills was organized by the Department of Medical Education. The facilitators of the session were Mr. Safder Javed and Mr. Syed Irfan Hussain. Participants were not only provided the information on MS EXCEL and data management but also given an opportunity for hands-on experience.

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In coversation with renowned Medical Educationiist

1. Qualification and degree awarding institute.

I have completed MBBS from Dow Medical College affiliated with Karachi University, MHPE from the University of Illinois Chicago, USA, and a Ph.D. from the University of Calgary, Alberta, Canada.



2. What made you pursue a degree in Medical Education?

I have always discouraged rote memorization and subjective assessments. Later, I had a teaching experience at the Department of Community Health Sciences, AKU, where I got exposure to innovative learning methodologies. I was fortunate to get selected as a trainee medical educationist (ME) at CPSP. and got a chance to learn from the Gurus of Medical Education in Pakistan namely Prof. Fazal Elahi and Prof. Naeem Jafarey. I was then selected for a WHO fellowship and learned from the giants of ME like Dr. Ara Tekian, Dr. George Bordage, and Dr. Arthur Elstein who further fueled my passion for ME.

3. What are your career aspirations as a Medical Educationist?

To improve the quality of MHPE programs and develop a CPD program for qualified junior medical educationists.

4. What are your significant contributions to the ME?

My main contributions are the capacity building of undergraduate and postgraduate education faculty of nursing, medicine, and dentistry. I have also promoted the field of HPE through role modeling, advocacy, and informal mentoring. I started the first-ever program in ME at the CPSP, Pakistan. It was a diploma in health professions education, which has been upgraded to a membership of the CPSP and recognized by the regulatory authorities for appointment as a faculty in medical colleges. I have contributed towards improving the quality of PG programs (MCPS and FCPS) by developing competency-based curricula and improving the quality of FCPS & MCPS examinations by conducting examiner training, standardizing the assessment forms for long and short cases, doing post-exam analysis, and providing feedback to item developers and examiners. My latest contribution is initiating the first Ph.D. program in HPE in Sindh.

5. What is your area of concentration in the ME?

Faculty development, Educational Measurement, and Program Evaluation

6. One aspect you want to improve in the ME and how to bring that change.

I want to focus on instilling compassion and empathy in health care professionals. This has to be integrated into the UG and PG curricula and requires role modeling by the faculty in clinical and basic sciences.

2. What made you pursue a degree in Medical Education?

To translate my experiences of medical education into a recognized diploma.

Continue to inspire learners and facilitators alike in staying partners in the • learning process

4. What are your significant contributions to Medical Education?

I have run hundreds of ME training workshops, and since 2004/5 I have been a faculty member at various training programs in Pakistan and abroad.

5. What is your area of concentration in Medical Education?

Theories of Learning, Attribution and Motivation, and Leadership.

6. One aspect you want to improve in ME and how to bring that change.

Initiation of clinical training of medical students in hospitals. This can be brought about by taking all forms of teaching to bedside and ward side.

Multiple Mini interviews MMI



SMDC takes pride to use MMI as a more reliable assessment to induct potential medical students. The MMI gives applicants multiple opportunities to showcase their skills throughout the interview, unlike the traditional one-on-one interview. The process of MMI is grounded in theory, supported through research, and reduces interviewer bias.

For the induction of the MBBS cohort of 2022-2027, DME along with the IT department has planned, managed, and supervised the entire process of MMI. 132 clinical and basic sciences faculty interviewed 675 candidates virtually. Candidates were interviewed by six different faculty members on six different stations to assess their motivation to resolve societal issues, ethics, empathy, leadership skills, communication skills, and critical thinking.

Faculty research contributions and achievements



This award is dedicated to the innovation in Clinical Ethics Consultation.
- Dr. Saleem Perwaiz Iqbal, Associate Professor of Community Medicine has been awarded the PHRG grant 2021 by the Shahid Hussain Foundation for the project titled "Effects of Lifestyle factors on Metabolically Healthy Obesity and Metabolic Syndrome among adults residing in a semi-urban area of Lahore, Pakistan".
- UHS arranged the first contact session of the certificate program (CMT) for the faculty of Mohtarma Benazir Bhutto Shaheed Medical College at Mirpur.
