ACTIVITY NEWS

Workshop: "Workplace-based assessment"



DME conducted a workshop on workplace-based assessment on March 21, 2022. Dr. Hasan Shoaib and Dr. Khalid Mahmood facilitated the session. The objectives of the session were to:

- Become familiar with the characteristics of an effective assessment and the impact of outcome/competency-based education on assessments.
- · Conduct Mini-CEX, DOPS, and CBD.
- Identify the barriers to the implementation of workplace-based assessment.

Session on "Problem Based Learning"

On January 14, 2022, DME arranged a session on Problem Based Learning. Dr. Syed Hasan Shoaib, Director, Medical Education Department, was the facilitator of the session. Clinical and Basic Sciences faculty participated in the workshop. The objectives of the session were to:

- Demonstrate the process of conducting PBL
- Differentiate between PBL and problem solving
- Identify the role of the Scribe, leader, and facilitator in PBL



Workshop: "How to Develop OSCE/OSPE stations"



DME arranged a workshop on "How to set OSCE/OSPE stations" on February 10, 2022. Dr. Syed Hasan Shoaib, Director Medical Education Department facilitated the session. Clinical and Basic sciences faculty participated in the workshop.

The objectives of the session were to:

- Construct OSCE stations
- Develop checklist
- Analyze and critique OSCE stations

Workshop: "Emotional Intelligence"

Dr. Khalid Mahmood Cheema, Deputy Director, DME, organized a session on "Emotional Intelligence in Health care professionals" on March 4, 2022. The aim of the session was to highlight the significance of Emotional Intelligence for effective practice, particularly with respect to delivering patient-centered care. The participants measured different domains of EI i.e. self-awareness, managing emotions, social skills, empathy, and managing emotions through a questionnaire and later the facilitator shared some ways to enhance Emotional Intelligence.



Workshop: "Course Design"

DME arranged a session on "Course design" and invited the Clinical and Basic Sciences faculty. **Dr. Syed Hasan Shoaib**, director Medical Education Department, facilitated the session with the objective of "Designing a course while incorporating the essential elements in its development".

Later, the participants designed a course incorporating the elements of course objectives, course content, activities, resources, assessment, and course evaluation.



"Team-Based Learning" Workshop

On March 28, 2022, a workshop was organized by the Department of Medical Education in collaboration with the Biochemistry department on "Team-based Learning". The session was conducted by **Dr. Khalid Mahmood Cheema**, Deputy Director Medical Education Department, and **Prof. Dr. Anila Jaleel**, Head of the Department of Biochemistry.

The objectives of the session were to:

- · Become familiar with Team-based learning TBL
- Appraise the utility of TBL
- Develop outcome-based TBL session
- Organize teaching/learning activities in TBL sessions for the maximum achievement of course outcomes



"SWOT Analysis" Activity

DME conducted a curriculum-based SWOT analysis of key areas such as teaching and learning methodologies, and assessment for all the five years of the MBBS program.

The entire activity was conducted in stages during the month of January 2022. <u>First</u>, the faculty were trained in carrying out the SWOT analysis, **second**, the faculty carried out the analysis and prepared a report along with the action plan. In the **last stage**,



DME compiled a report with the aim to submit the report along with the recommendations to the senior management. And later, to get the approval for the proposed recommendations from the Curriculum Committee and Academic Council.

Mentoring Program

A Mentoring session was organized for the students of 1st year on February 3, 2022. In the first half, a plenary session was held in which Prof. Dr. Saad Bashir Malik (Head of the Psychiatry Department) shed light on the importance of "Knowing yourself". Further, he emphasized the importance of self-awareness, becoming aware of ones' strengths and weaknesses.

In the second half, mentees spent time with their mentors and discussed the progress of their academics and the challenges they might face.



Workshop: "Clinical Leadership"

A session on "Clinical Leadership" was arranged by **Dr. Khalid Mahmood Cheema.** Deputy Director, Medical Education Department on February 15, 2022. Clinical Leadership is an integral component of the healthcare system and a requirement of hospital care, including system performance, achievement of health reform objectives, timely care delivery, system integrity, and efficiency. The objectives of the session were to:

- Contrast different leadership styles
- Appraise the attributes of a good leader
- Recognize and prioritize the unique attributes of a good leader.

Interview with Dr. Naveed Yousuf

"I aspire to positively impact the lives of students and faculty in health professions by introducing innovative programs leading to creating a safe and enabling environment so that medical students graduate as professional doctors".

1. Qualification and degree awarding institute.

I have completed MBBS (Sindh Medical College, Karachi University), MBA-Health Management (Institute of Business Management), Advanced Diploma in Health Professions Education (Aga Khan University), Fellowship in Medical Education (M) (University of Illinois Chicago), and PhD-ME (University of Ambrosiana, Italy).

2. What made you pursue a degree in Medical Education?

I always had a passion for teaching and after my graduation in 2003, I joined Fatima Jinnah Dental College as a Demonstrator in Pathology, and then Ziauddin Medical University as a Lecturer in Basic Health Sciences. At Ziauddin University (ZU), My mentors like Professor Naeem Jafarey and Ms. Nighat Huda inspired me to take up a career in ME. At ZU, I was exposed to contemporary teaching/ learning methods like Problem-based Learning. We were offered continuous professional development in ME. My aspiration to get a graduate qualification in ME brought me to the Department for Educational Development (DED) at Aga Khan University (AKU) in 2008. AKU was planning to offer the first Master of Health Professions Education (HPE) Programme. I was blessed to have Professor Rukhsana W. Zuberi as my mentor at AKU. AKU and DED provided me the opportunities to grow and excel in the field of Health Professions Education (HPE). The journey of learning, then, never stopped.

3. What are your career aspirations as a Medical Educationist?

I aspire to contribute to the advancement of HPE through cutting-edge research and capacity development of health professions educators.

4. What are your significant contributions to the ME?

"The journey of a thousand miles begins with one step". I have contributed to the initiation and advancement of assessments and their quality assurance at both institutional and national levels. At AKU, I initiated "Standard Setting" "Psychometric analysis of Objective Structured Clinical Examinations" (OSCEs) for the first time in Pakistan. My research on the Standard Setting of OSCEs published in an International Journal Teaching and Learning in Medicine was selected as one of the top five articles for the Second Annual Editors' Choice Award in 2015-16. In 2013, AKU Medical College was one of the first two institutions across the globe to receive ASPIRE Excellence in ME Award in Student Assessment. At the national level, I am a member of Technocrat's Assessment Group to suggest policies & strategic guidelines for the development and implementation of the first-ever National Licensure Exam in Pakistan.

5. What is your area of concentration in Medical Education?

My areas of specialization in Health Professions Education are Student Assessment including Psychometric Analysis, Academic Leadership, and Strategic Management.

6. One aspect you want to improve in Medical Education and how to bring that change.

I have obtained a BDS degree from Khyber College of Dentistry, a Master of Public Health, a Master in Medical Education (ME), and a Ph.D. in ME from the University of Dundee. I have been awarded a Fellowship of Faculty of Dental Trainers, Royal College of Surgeons Edinburgh, Fellowship of the Higher Education Academy, and Membership of the Academy of Medical Educators in recognition of my commitment to professionalism in teaching and learning in Higher Education. Currently, I am pursuing a Postdoctoral Fellowship at FAIMER Institute, Philadelphia.

2. What made you pursue a degree in Medical Education?

The desire to bring positive change in health professions education was the driving force towards pursuing a career in ME. One needs to possess strong leadership and decision-making skills to shape a career in ME. Real-time thinking and rightly employing knowledge is an essential part of a medical educationist's job; one little mistake can affect a student's life to a greater extent. It gives one a big responsibility of improving students' lives. The impact of what we do with the curriculum is huge. It brings the incomparable joy and satisfaction that led me to opt for ME.

3. What are your career aspirations as a Medical Educationist?

I aim to reach the global stage, albeit with perseverance and utmost dedication. Constant development in technology up-gradation is required to design innovative solutions and adapt to the evolving educational landscape. There's also the need of opening the state of the art institutions

programs in Pakistan.

4. What are your significant contributions to ME?

I am developing the first blended learning postgraduate program in Health Professions Education in the Gulf region. I have led the undergraduate curriculum reforms, faculty development, and teaching/supervision of postgraduate students in ME at Khyber Medical University. I am also a member of the ME committee at PMC developing national regulations on undergraduate, postgraduate, and continuing ME.

6. What is your area of concentration in Medical Education?

I maintain active research and teaching profile, focusing on curriculum, assessment, faculty development, and professional identity. My presence has strengthened the research supervision capacity to initiate Masters' and Ph.D. programs in ME.

7. One aspect you want to improve in the ME and how to bring that change.

Society has entrusted medical universities to ensure that each graduate of their program is competent health professional. Assessment against a set criterion by the license awarding institutes is an integral component for establishing the fitness to practice in any field of healthcare.

One key issue is the allocation of pass marks to students who do not display competence at a satisfactory level, a complex phenomenon known as 'Failure to Fail'. The literature suggests that 'failure to fail' is a real issue with many complex facets. Given the costs of ME and the potential social and professional costs of poor-quality medical graduates, rigorous research and actions are required.




