### "THINKING OUT LOUD"



In this edition of thinking out loud,

Dr. Hasan Shoaib gave the idea of appropriate content for the curriculum, according to the needs of the community.

### Dilemma in the medical Curriculum

We as educators are still not sure that how can we cater our undergraduate curriculum to our needs. The primary purpose of becoming a medical doctor is to provide primary health care to the community. So all the subject should be taught according to the requirements of Primary health care.

To do so, we have to make sure what content should we choose that can cater to the needs of the community. One of the important subjects is Anatomy which we try to teach too much. If we analyze the number of allocated hours for Anatomy, it is on the higher side, however it has come down compared to the previous years. Within this subject, greater emphasis is laid on the teaching of limbs and major chunk of the time is spent on its teaching. The Anatomy of Thorax is given less time, although patients coming with problems of thorax are much higher than limbs.

Another important area is that in UHS Curriculum, the boundaries of the Anatomy subject is not explicit and neither the teacher nor the students know what to teach and learn. In this context UHS should make the Curriculum explicit for both the faculty and the students.

So the Universities need to think rationally rather than making students mini scientists of individual subjects, they should include the relevant material in the curriculum based on its importance.

The objectives of the workshop were to:


- describe teacher-student relationship


