



# Interview with Dr. Amir Burney



#### 1. Qualification and degree awarding institute.

- MMedSci Masters in Medical Education (University of Nottingham).
- FRCS (Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh).
- Masters in Sports and Exercise Medicine (University of Nottingham).
- MBBS (Dow University of Health Sciences, Karachi).

### 3. What are your career aspirations as a Medical Educationist?

To be recognised as a leader in the field of medical education.

To understand modern technologies developed virtual being in augmented reality and their application in simulation training in undergraduate medical education and to develop collaborative organisational working relationships with leading medical universities of Pakistan to help educate the next generation of medical students and medical educators.

#### 2. What made you pursue a degree in Medical Education?

I was always interested in teaching and training medical students and junior doctors.

I believe that it is our duty to train the next generation of healthcare professionals as and when possible. I was also interested in learning how medical schools work and function as an organisation and how could I also be part of a medical school faculty.

The twofold interest in medical education then made me consider a formal degree in medical education so that I could better understand the principles of adult learning, curriculum development and formulating assessments, and how could apply them in my workplace.

### 4. One aspect you want to improve in Medical Education.

Integration of technology and digital resources to enhance learning and training.
 Incorporating virtual reality technologies (VR) into medical education can provide realistic and immersive experiences for students. For example, virtual simulations can be used for surgical training, anatomy lessons, and diagnostic scenarios.
 A better utilisation of online platforms, webinars, and mobile applications will help to update knowledge, research, and guidelines in relation to teaching and learning, allowing medical educators to stay current with the latest advancements in medical education.

### 5. What you think are the major issues that we are facing in medical education at present?

- 1- Mental health wellbeing and preventing student burnout at undergraduate level are critical areas and must be addressed as a priority.
- 2- It is important that the support programmes are developed and implemented which will help encourage students from all social classes to apply for studying medicine.
- 3- Medicine is a profession where you learn to work as a team member and its important that we stress the importance of working collaboratively to our students and enhance their engagement with their peers and colleagues whilst working on clinical placements.

### 7. What is your area of concentration in Medical Education?

Curriculum planning and delivery, and development and implementation of assessments, Organisation of face-to-face events and online career guidance webinars where students are provided with a forum with useful resources and information regarding a career in medicine.

### 6. What are your significant contributions to Medical Education?

I developed the e-clinical Skills Logbook, which is part of the students' e-portfolios at the Medical School, University of Sheffield.

I have also developed teaching and learning collaborations with the University of Sheffield, United Kingdom and three leading medical universities in Pakistan. As a result of these collaborations, we have delivered staff development online workshops across Pakistan.

My other professional and external standing include being a member of the Yorkshire and Humber Clinical Skills Advisory Group (YHCS Advisory Group) from 2015 to 2019, the Yorkshire and Humber Clinical Skills and Simulation Network and the UK Council of Clinical Skills Teachers. I am also an external examiner for the University of Health Sciences, Lahore, Pakistan for their Masters program.

I also sit on EDI (Equality, Diversity, Inclusion) panels both locally at Sheffield Medical School and nationally on the MSC EDI Alliance (Medical School Council) and have a particular interest in Decolonisation of medical curriculum.
