



Interview with Dr. Sobia Ali



1. Qualification and degree awarding institute.

I did MBBS from Sindh Medical
College in 1999 and Masters in Health
Professions Education from Dow
University of Health Sciences in 2012.
At present, I am a PhD Scholar at
University of Cape Town, South Africa.

3. What are your career aspirations as a Medical Educationist?

I am currently enrolled in PhD program at University of Cape Town, South Africa. I am doing so because I would like to deepen my expertise in medical education by conducting original research and contributing new knowledge to my field.

2. What made you pursue a degree in Medical Education?

I didn't plan on going into medical education, but it happened kind of by accident. After eight years of my graduation, I joined a medical college as a lecturer (because of family reasons). Surprisingly, I started really liking teaching and wanted to do it better. That's when I discovered there's a whole science and art to improve medical education. I decided to enroll in a Masters program at Dow, and that is where my journey continued.

While my entry into medical education might have been accidental, I accepted it wholeheartedly as I recognized the meaningful impact one could have on shaping the next generation of educators (esp. in the context of health professions educators).

4. One aspect you want to improve in Medical Education.

I am interested in working on the identification of competencies, with special focus on the "realistic" ones. More importantly, I aim to develop a structured training program to attain these competencies, whether in the undergraduate or postgraduate domain. Often, in the Pakistani context when reviewing training program details, there is always an impressive way of describing complex (or fancy) terms as competencies.

However, there is often minimal effort invested in structuring the training to effectively achieve these competencies.

5. What you think are the major issues that we are facing in medical education at present?

In Pakistan, we are used to adopt competencies already developed in the West but because of our changed context (whether in term of sociocultural, economical and/or political) we failed to achieve these competencies in true sense. This is because we still don't believe of having structured training programs aimed at achieving the competencies and leave it as opportunistic learning. Developing our training programs according to our context is the biggest challenge we need to work on.

7. What is your area of concentration in Medical Education?

Program Development and Faculty Development is my area of concentration in Medical Education

6. What are your significant contributions to Medical Education?

I have structured and conducted MMI for undergraduate medical admission, developed a study skills course for medical undergraduates as a standalone program, and implemented a communication skills course as a longitudinal theme. Other longitudinal theme curricula on which I am working include ethics and professionalism and patient safety. All these curricula have been developed and implemented while considering our organizational context within the broad framework provided by the University. While they are currently in their infancy, they will be evaluated once we complete a two-year cycle.
